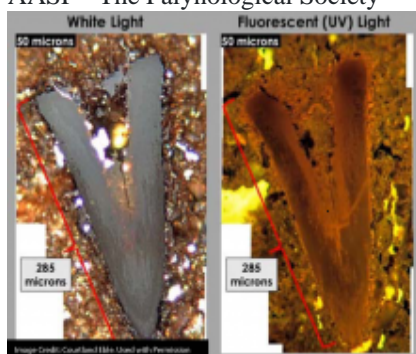


TSOP: "Godzillanite" - Unusually Large Pieces of Bitumen

The Society for Organic Petrology shared a fun story authored by Cortland Eble of the Kentucky Geological Survey/The University of Kentucky. In his work on the Cleveland Member of the Late Devonian Ohio Shale he has identified unusually large pieces of bitumen that he has dubbed "Godzillanite."
