RE: Call for 2019 AGI Nominations

AGI is seeking quality candidates for American Geosciences Institute 2019 awards and 2020 officer positions. We hope that the slates of candidates will represent the breadth of the AGI member organizations. Therefore we encourage you to work with your society's leaders and award committees to help us identify (1) past or current leaders who might contribute to the AGI Executive Committee and (2) exceptional geoscientists from your membership whose career contributions match the criteria for the AGI awards. The formal nomination process is not too cumbersome – basically a completed nomination form. However, additional information in the form of supporting letters and biographical information or, particularly in cases of award nominees, a relatively complete CV can be very helpful to the committees. Additional suggestions on what makes an effective nomination are included as an attachment to this memo.

Your nominations need to be received by February 1, 2019, in order to be reviewed by the AGI Nominating Committee making recommendations for the 2020 officers and 2019 awards. Specifically AGI is seeking nominations for the following Executive Committee positions and awards:

Multiple nominations for a single position are welcome if you know of several suitable candidates. In addition to the nomination form, please also include a biography or CV that documents the qualifications and experience of your candidate(s). Letters of support may be sent for each nominee and, if provided, will be included in the package sent to the 2019 Nominating Committee.

Medal in Memory of Ian Campbell for Superlative Service to the Geosciences

The Medal in Memory of Ian Campbell for Superlative Service to the Geosciences is awarded in recognition of an individual's performance and contributions to the geoscience profession. Candidates are measured against the distinguished career of Ian Campbell, whose service to the profession touched virtually every facet of the geosciences. Campbell was a most uncommon man of remarkable accomplishment and widespread influence in his career as a geologist, educator, administrator, and public servant as well as being noted for his candor and integrity. The award is limited to one per year. The recipient must be living at the time of selection. The medal is presented by the president of AGI or other citationist during the national meeting of the Geological Society of America at the time of the presentation of the GSA medals. The successful candidate will be a senior scientist of national recognition and living at the time of selection and is expected to personally accept the award. This award, established in 1999, was named in late 2006.

HINTS FOR SUBMITTING OFFICER AND AWARD NOMINATIONS

Each year AGI's Nominating Committees receive a batch of nominations. Sometimes the nominees are not known by the Nominating Committee members so nominations that clearly cite evidence that the candidate would be an effective member of the Executive Committee or that the candidate has career accomplishments that merit the award are VERY helpful. While multi-page CVs can show achievements, and are particularly important for award nominations, they may not highlight the most obvious reason why the individual is being nominated. Help your nomination stand out in the crowd by providing a compelling summary of these reasons on the nomination form and in supporting letters.

Below are some questions to stimulate your thinking:

Outstanding Lifetime Contributions to the Geosciences

Are there publications or other scientific contributions the nominee is well known for?

How have the candidate's accomplishments influenced subsequent research or practice in the geosciences?

What personal characteristics make this individual noteworthy?

Service to Geoscience Societies (please do not just paste-in CV data)

Was there an instance of going above and beyond?

Are there examples of exceptional leadership and/or teamwork?

How does the geoscience community benefit from nominee's professional service?

Professional Career Experience

Has the nominee's career included officer/leadership positions?

Were there actions beyond the normal requirements of the nominee's job?

What were the results of the nominee's achievement(s)?

What impact did the nominee have on academia, industry, government, or the public?

Additional Comments in Support of the Candidate

Why is the individual's achievement significant and deserving of recognition?

Was there an issue, problem, or situation that the individual successfully addressed?

Cite how the nominee's position or job responsibilities suit the nomination.

Are there characteristics that make this individual noteworthy?

Describe collaborative efforts with other disciplines and/or departments.

Did nominee's contribution/achievement enhance diversity or foster development?

Are there co-workers, former students, or others who can provide examples or support letters?

Using additional pages to provide information or bulleting information is encouraged and providing the letters of support (up to three allowed) always strengthens a nomination.
